Roger Akelius and Sweden's **Akelius Foundation** are currently in the global spotlight for their ambitious plan to build 400 schools and provide meals for approximately 100,000 children in the conflict-affected Gaza Strip. More than **650,000 children in Gaza** have been deprived of access to education for over two years, after approximately **97% of school facilities were destroyed** by conflict and bombing. In response, the Akelius Foundation is committed to rebuilding lost educational facilities and providing daily nutritional support to children in dire need.

The Akelius Foundation's latest donation to Gaza is **US\$75 million**, building on the US\$60 million it previously provided to Palestine. This is being done in collaboration with the Swedish government and international organizations such as the United Nations Children's Fund (**UNICEF**).

Profile of Roger Akelius and the Akelius Foundation

Roger Akelius is a Swedish entrepreneur who founded the Akelius Foundation in 2007. The foundation focuses primarily on education and humanitarian causes, with an annual budget of approximately **US\$300 million**. The foundation also runs a free online learning program with a team of approximately 150 staff members specializing in languages and mathematics.

In addition to Gaza, the Akelius Foundation has supported various educational programs in more than 40 countries, specializing in the application of innovative and accessible modern pedagogical methods.

Collaboration with Global Humanitarian Institutions

The Akelius Foundation does not operate alone. They collaborate closely with international humanitarian agencies such as UNICEF, the UN refugee agency (**UNHCR**), SOS Children's Villages, which focuses on caring for orphaned and abandoned children, and the humanitarian medical organization **Doctors Without Borders (MSF)**. This synergy ensures that aid goes beyond education to address the basic needs and health of affected children.

Benefits and Impact of the Program in Gaza

- **Building 400 schools** to replace destroyed facilities and provide a safe learning environment.
- **Providing daily meals** for 100,000 children experiencing hunger and malnutrition.
- **Improving access to education** for hundreds of thousands of children who have been cut off from school.
- **Strengthening collaboration** between international and local organizations for program sustainability.
